**STREETS DEPARTMENT ANNOUNCES STREET
IMPROVEMENT FOR WEEK OF MAY 21**

Temporary, Full Street Closures and Parking Restrictions Expected

PHILADELPHIA – The following streets are scheduled for street improvement work during the week of May 21st, Streets Commissioner Carlton Williams announced today. The work schedule includes temporary, full street closures and parking restrictions. Weather or special events in the area may alter the work schedule.

Below are streets scheduled for paving, a final phase in the resurfacing process. Operations for paving will be performed during the day hours, between 7AM and 4PM. The anticipated time to complete the paving of each street segment varies and is dependent on the length and width of the street. Work is being performed by City crews.

To complete the work residents should expect parking restrictions. Temporary 'No Parking' signs will be posted in advance of each scheduled activity. Residents are urged to move their cars from the work sites when temporary 'No Parking' signs are posted, so that vehicles are not towed. In the event a car is towed, please contact your local Police District to determine its location. Motorists are advised to allow extra time when traveling around the work areas.

While the Streets Department will make every effort to minimize disruption to traffic, citizens are urged to plan ahead and use alternative routes when traveling in these areas. The Streets Department thanks citizens in advance for their patience and cooperation as we work to improve city streets.
